Nadia Somekh Professor of FAU Mackenzie University, PHD (1994) FAUUSP worked from 1974 to 1986 at COGEP – Coordenadoria Geral de Planejamento, afterwards called Secretaria Municipal de Planejamento (SEMPPLA) doing research on the evolution of Urban Land prices, Urban projects ou historial heritage and revising the Master Plan of São Paulo City.

From 1989 to 1992 still in SEMPLA was one of the members of the Coordination team of the 1991 Master Plan of São Paulo.

From 1988 to 1989 and 1993 to 1995 she was the planning Coordinator of CDHU (Urban and Housing Development Company) Working on Housing Programs. In 1996 she was the Environment and Planning Secretary of São José dos Campos in charge of elaboration the Land Use Law.

From 1997 to 2002 she was Advisor and Development Economy Secretary of Santo André City. From 2002 to 2004 she was the EMURB (Municipal Urbanization Company) President, mainly in charge of the Urban Operations and the Central Area Rehabilitation Program.

From 2005 until 2009 she was the dean of School of Architecture and Urbanism of Mackenzie University. In February of 2009 until march2010 she was in charge of the Urban and Regional Planning of São Bernardo do Campo, in ABC Region, she was also UIA ( International Architects Union) councilor (2008/2011).
